# Application Guidelines for the 1st NCAR Study Tour in Korea Organized by National Center for Art Research

The National Center for Art Research (NCAR), established as part of the Independent Administrative Institution National Museums of Art, will hold a NCAR Study Tour for curators and researchers from Japan and abroad with the aim of building an ongoing network among national museums and art experts in Japan and abroad. Through this program, we aim to deepen mutual intellectual exchange and create possibilities for future collaboration and joint research.

This year's NCAR Study Tour will target Korea as a research region, with the aim of deepening the ongoing dialogue between Japan and Korea in the field of art. The main contents of the program will include visits to museums and art institutions that showcase exhibitions and house collections with a focus on contemporary art, guided tours by Korean curators tailored to participants' preferences, and opportunities to present and exchange opinions among participants. The National Art Research Center invites applicants for this program as follows:

# 1. Eligibility

Curators or researchers in Japan who plan exhibitions or conduct research related to the art scene in Korea (up to 10 participants)

\*In addition to the above, researchers affiliated with the National Museum of Art (about one researcher from each museum) are expected to participate.

2. Period of stay

Monday, November 13 through Friday, November 17, 2023 (5 days in total)

3. Places to stay (tentative)

Seoul, Busan and Ulsan Cities

- 7. Eligibility requirements
- (a) Applicants who have an interest in the study of Korean art with a track record of activities and research in the field which they specialize in.
- (b) Fully understand the purpose of the program (research related to contemporary art in Korea) and be able to participate in all itineraries.
- (c) Be able to communicate adequately in English and strive for mutual understanding and exchange with the program participants.
- (d) Be able to give a presentation on their own research and activities, and the results of their participation in the program (about 5 to 10 minutes per person) at a prospect meeting during the program.
- (e) Have a concrete plan and intention to continuously utilize the results of the program in future activities and research.
- (f) Be cooperative in attending symposiums and workshops when organized by NCAR in the future for the follow-up of this project and publicity activities for the program.
- (g) Not engage in any commercial or other for-profit activities during their stay in the program.
- (h) Be able to submit a report (record of activities and research) after participating in the program.

9. Selection schedule

Selection (document review only) is scheduled for mid-September 2023.
