

**Application Guidelines for the 7th NCAR Study Tour in Norway, Sweden, and Finland
Organized by the National Center for Art Research, Japan**

The National Center for Art Research (NCAR) annually hosts the NCAR Study Tours for curators and researchers based in Japan with the aim of building an international network in the field of arts. The program aims to foster ongoing networking among national art museums and art professionals worldwide, deepening intellectual exchange and creating opportunities for future collaborative projects and joint research.

The 7th NCAR Study Tour will dispatch Japanese art specialists to the three Nordic countries (Norway, Sweden, and Finland). This tour features a program designed to examine the Nordic art scene from multiple perspectives through visits to major modern and contemporary art museums and galleries, artists' studios, art fairs, and other venues. Through dialogue with local curators and art professionals, participants will deepen their understanding of various strategies and concrete approaches in cultural and artistic initiatives. This valuable opportunity will enable them to apply the knowledge and networks gained during the program to their future projects and research.

The National Center for Art Research calls for applications to this program as follows:

1. Eligibility

Curators or researchers in Japan who have strong interests in the art landscape and museum initiatives in Nordic countries (Norway, Sweden and Finland), who plan exhibitions or conduct research related to the region's art scene.

*Additionally, researchers from National Museums of Art, Japan (up to one participant per institution) will participate.

2. Period of stay

Sunday, April 19 through Wednesday, April 29, 2026 (9 nights, 11 days)

3. Places to visit

Oslo, Stockholm, Helsinki

6. Support details

- Inspection expenses (major transportation costs within the host country, certain admission fees, etc.)
- Travel expenses (round-trip airfare between Japan and the host country), lodging, lodging allowance (as per institution regulations)

- Interpreters will not be provided on this tour. All communication will be in English.
- If selected applicants cancel their participation after confirming their attendance due to personal circumstances or reasons, they will be responsible for any cancellation fee incurred at that time for already arranged airline tickets, hotels, etc. Please be aware of this in advance.

7. Eligibility requirements

- (a) Applicants who have strong interests in the art landscape and museum initiatives in the Nordic countries, along with a track record of activities and research in their specialized field.
- (b) Fully understand the purpose of the program (research and exchange in the art scene of the Nordic countries) and be able to participate in all itineraries.
- (c) Be able to communicate adequately in English and strive for mutual understanding and exchange with the program participants.
- (d) Be able to present your own research/activities and the results of your participation at exchange sessions during the program (about 5-10 minutes per person).
- (e) Have a concrete plan and intention to continuously utilize the results of the program in future activities and research.
- (f) Be cooperative in attending meetings, symposiums and workshops when organized by NCAR in the future for the follow-up of this project, and publicity activities for the program.
- (g) Not engage in any commercial or other for-profit activities during their stay in the program.
- (h) Be able to submit a report (record of activities and research) after participating in the program.

8. Application deadline

Application period: Friday, January 9th to Friday, January 30th, 2026, at 5:00 p.m. JST.

9. Selection schedule

Selection (document review only) is scheduled in early February 2026.

*Results will be notified individually by late-February 2026. Please note that we will not be able to respond to individual inquiries regarding the selection process or results.
